Universidad de Granada Library Staff Training Week 2025

As every year, the University of Granada Library (Spain) organizes its Staff Training Week from May 5 to 9, 2025, in collaboration with the Vice-Rector for Internationalization. This initiative is developed within the framework of the Erasmus+ program of the European Commission and the University of Granada's own Internationalization Strategy, and involves the visit and exchange of technical knowledge and professional experience of librarians from different countries and cultures, with the aim of continuous improvement of all the institutions.

The training will be conducted by professionals from the University Library, professors, and staff from other administrative units of the University of Granada. Visitors are also welcome to make presentations about their home institution or area of expertise.

The training will be held in English.

Some of the topics we will discuss and the activities we will have in 2025 Week are: digital repositories and transformative agreements, science policies in Spain and Europe, interculturalism in a bicontinental university, library adaptation for visual impairment, library services, interlibrary cooperation and networking, library premises visits, and cultural guided tours.
